ALLOIS

People, landscape, and abstract shapes exist on equal footing in Allois's work. She uses pastels and oil to impulsively render her magical fantasy world. Works such as "Night Beauty" show Allois's combination of figurative abstraction and uplifting surrealism.

Her work repeats themes of blossoming and growth; people and flowers are united with the landscape. With strong ties to the world of psychology, she looks to artists such as Van Gogh, Munch, Ernst and Nolde, who also exhibit a link to the subconscious world. "Working intuitively and automatically, her work reveals a magical synthesis: a fantasy world of strange creatures, surreal landscapes and representational painting" (Artis Spectrum, volume 12, 2004).

TAMARA BALENKO

Born in the town of Uzin, Ukraine, Tamara Balenko graduated from Odessa State Art College with a major in Painting and Drawing in 1977, and then earned her Master of Fine Arts in Illustration and Book Design from the National University of Print Production in Kiev, Ukraine in 1985.

After immigrating to the United States in 1998, Tamara continued her studies at Los Angeles Valley College and obtained a Certificate in Graphic Design in 2003. She also continued her teaching career and became the owner and the director of Golden Key Art where people of all ages receive professional art training.

Tamara Balenko has been a member of the Ukrainian Artists' Union since 1993. Tamara's award-winning art has been exhibited in numerous countries, including Canada, Portugal, Poland, Belgium, and the United States. Among her esteemed collectors are the Memorial Museum of Paul Verlaine in Metz, France, the Brunico Graphic Museum of Art in Brunico, Italy, and the National Museum of Kievo-Pecherscaya Lavra in Kiev, Ukraine. Tamara's works and biography were included in Encyclopedia of Modern Ex-libris in Portugal and Encyclopedia of Contemporary Ukraine.





Alexander Anchipolovsky was born in 1958 in Tashkent, Uzbekistan, a part of the former Soviet Union.

Alexander graduated from the College of Art, in Tashkent in 1981 and then became a teacher in the Art Studio in Tashkent. In 1989, Alexander graduated from the Institute of Theater and Art in Tashkent. He has since contributed to the publishing field in Tashkent with designs for over 100 book covers, and illustrations for fifteen books. His first solo exhibition was in 1986 - Republic Art Exhibit "Young Artists Show" in Tashkent. From 1992 until 1993, Alexander worked as Art Manager in the Art International Company of Tashkent. In 1999, he was the Colorado Artists Guild Award winner for "Best in Show". In 2000, he participated in the American Watercolor Society Juried Show "133rd Annual International Exhibition", Salmagundi Club, New York, New York. Alexander has been commissioned to do work on a women's calendar in Los Angeles. He currently works in his own studio.

Her artwork is exhibited in private galleries in Yerevan (Armenia), Detroit (USA), St. Petersburg and Moscow (Russia). Her first solo exhibition in 1992 in Yerevan was recognized by art critics as an exceptionally remarkable event in the Armenian art world of those days. From 1989 until 1999, Anush designed a series of exhibitions for the History Museum of Armenia. In 1999, her family relocated to the United States. Since 2000, Anush has served as the Head of the Art Department of the Academy of Music and Fine Arts in North Hollywood, California. In addition to her duties at the Academy, she continues to work on her own personal art project titled "Return of Angels". In 2002, she traveled to Armenia to present her works at an exhibition dedicated to her mother's 50th anniversary as an artist and educator. In March of 2004, the first segment of the "Return of Angels" exhibition series opened in the United States.



After two years of feeding his passion, he set out for an art school at the age of seven. There, his artistic talent blossomed. At such a small age, he was already getting his artwork put into galleries for display.

Several years later, while serving for the army stationed in Germany, he was recognized as a great artist. From there, he attended Art College in Armenia. After that, he continued to do woodcarvings and paintings. At this time Mahatma Gandhi, had come to visit Armenia. During his stay he discovered Faro's work and fell in love. His love was rewarded with a woodcarving given as a gift by Faro. After that, Faro came to America.

It wasn't until 1995 that he named his original style of art as "Modern Classic". From then on, he knew that he would now walk down the path of art. For many years, his work was displayed in several places. He participated in the Beverly Hills open art show for many years. From there he received a lot of appreciation for the art community. He then took part in a gallery with other artists at the Northridge art center. He also took part in an Art Exhibition at the Glendale Civic Center along with many other artists. His unique talent was further displayed at an art show with 100 other Armenian artists at Yepremyan Banquet Hall and again at the Noho Art Gallery. He still participates in many art shows. 


ROBERT GRIGORIAN






SELF-PORTRAIT WITHOUT BACKGROUND 2001, oil on cardboard, 20" x 16"




APPLES 2003, print on canvas, 48" x 48"



Pictures of his sculptures have been published in magazines, books, encyclopedias and on postcards.










